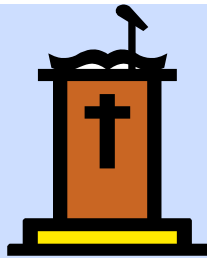

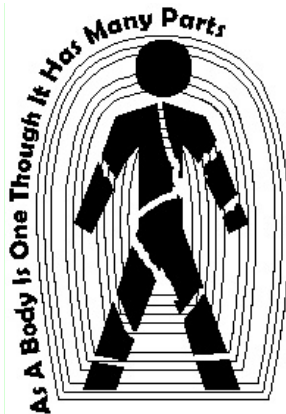


New Beginnings welcomes Kirk Probasco

Kirk suggests...

"The central point in Paul's teaching is the notion that all of Jesus' followers are united. Paul believes that there is a real physical and mental link between us. He uses the human body as an illustration of this basic thought. Your body is a combination of many individual components: hands, feet, eyes, bones, etc.. Today, we might compare it with a computer that has a monitor, keyboard, central processor, modem - all linked together by wires (or even wireless). The Holy Spirit is the connecting link in our faith-body. He (or She) harmonizes our individual gifts for the benefit of the whole community."

The point is, no one part can do it alone. Join Kirk as he illustrates how not only faith, but "Church is a Team Sport."

Our study of the bible will resume next Sunday, March 1st at the regular time.

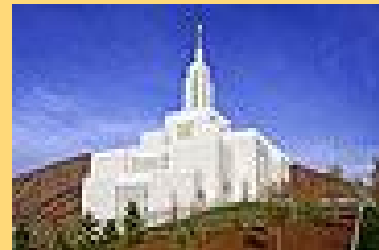
March 7, Saturday---
